We invite you to join our virtual annual meeting to learn about the Credit Union's financial position and plans for the future. The meeting will be held via Zoom Webinar. Information to sign up for the meeting will be available to members April 2021.



One very important way in which credit unions differ from other financial service providers is our volunteer board of directors. The board members volunteer their time to set Credit Union policies and provide direction for the management staff.

A nominating committee recommends a slate of Credit Union members to fill open board positions for the upcoming year. Currently, Emory Alliance Credit Union has 11 directors, and has four board positions open for nomination and placement. Individuals nominated to fill these positions are listed on the back.

Nomination Procedures

According to Emory Alliance Credit Union bylaws, director nominations may also be made by petition. To have a valid petition:

- It must be signed by one percent of its members.
- Each petition must include a statement of qualifications and brief biographical data on the person being nominated, and
- The person being nominated must sign an acknowledgment stating that, if elected, he or she is willing to serve.

Petitions may be obtained at any Emory Alliance Credit Union office. Petitions must be received at the Credit Union no later than March 14, 2021. The election will not be conducted by ballot and there will be no nominations from the floor when there is only one nominee for each position to be filled. The minimum age for voting is 16, and the minimum age to hold office is 18.

The secretary of the Credit Union will post all nominations for board vacancies at each Credit Union office. And, if there is more than one nominee for each available position, the secretary will send out ballots to all eligible Emory Alliance Credit Union voters at least 30 days prior to the Annual Meeting date.

Beverly Cormican

Beverly Cormican has worked in higher education for the past 37 years, 30 of which have been at Emory University. She received her undergraduate degree from Bob Jones University and her graduate degrees from the University of Georgia. She held multiple roles during her career at Emory, including serving as the Assistant Vice President for Business with responsibilities for the University's real estate portfolio and related administrative matters for the Office of the Executive Vice President for Finance and Administration. Before retiring from Emory, she served as the Associate Vice Provost for Continuing Education with responsibilities for non-credit programs for non-traditional students under the Office of the Provost.

Beverly has been a member of the Credit Union since 1992 and currently serves on the Asset Liability Management Committee. Previously she served on the Loan Committee beginning in 2005 and served as chair from 2012 until 2018.

Joanna Green

Joanna Green currently serves as the Chief Business Officer (CBO) for the division of Library and IT Services (LITS) at Emory University. In this capacity she oversees finance, human resources, and space allocations as well as general operational support. She has 25+ years of experience in business administration. Prior to joining Emory, Joanna spent 10 years at Children's Healthcare of Atlanta's Egleston location – also in business administration roles before coming to Emory as the Director of Finance for the Goizueta Business School. She spent roughly 19 years at Goizueta before transitioning from the school CBO role to her current CBO role with LITS.

Joanna earned both her Master of Business Administration and Bachelor of Business Administration from the University of Georgia. In addition, to her work at Emory, she is the mother of 3 children and a former board member of the CFO forum. Joanna has been a member of the Credit Union since 1990 serving at various times on the Supervisory Committee, Executive Committee, and the ALM Committee.

Heather Mugg

Heather has worked in higher education for over 30 years. Her professional career began at the Goizueta Business School where she managed all degree program operations and student service functions. She later left Emory to pursue a position as a Director in proprietary education, eventually becoming Campus President for the same institution. Heather returned to Emory in February, 1999, as a Project Director to lead the implementation of the Oracle/PeopleSoft Student System.

In the Spring of 2006, she was promoted to Associate Vice Provost to oversee operations and systems for the Enrollment Services Division, within the Office of the Provost. In the summer of 2017, Heather assumed a new role as the Associate Vice Provost for Undergraduate Affairs. She completed her Bachelor of Arts from Emory University, a Master of Science in Human Resource Development from Georgia State University, and a Doctorate in Higher Education Policy from Vanderbilt University. She currently serves as Secretary of the Board.

Roland Witter

Roland Witter currently serves as the Senior Financial Analyst for Emory University's Division of Campus Life. In this capacity he facilitates system to system interfaces, electronic batch transaction processing, reconciliation, reporting, analysis, process improvement and automation. He earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Business Administration with a concentration in Banking and Finance from Morehouse College, then began his career with First Union National Bank (which has since merged with Wells Fargo). He joined Emory in 1998, initially serving as the lead accountant for EmoryCard (Emory's in-house debit card system).

Over the years he has managed finances for the entire Emory Campus Life portfolio including the Bookstores, Dining and Student Health. Roland has served Emory Alliance Credit Union as a member of the Delinquent Loan Committee since 2005, Committee Chair since 2018, and was appointed to the Board in 2017.
